- Initiated meetings with the Mayor's Office to improve Fire and Police communications in the Canyon.
- Provided UMCA Members with assistance in meeting their LAFD Brush Clearance requirements.
- Hosted the UMCA 2006 Canyon Festival, bringing Canyon residents together for a day of entertainment and fun, promoting a sense of community.
- Worked with the neighboring Associations to improve private security patrol services offered to Canyon residents.
- Worked with Government and the Brentwood Community Council on issues of community concern, such as water pollution, flood protection and development of the VA property.
- Closely monitored development and zoning threats to the Canyon and surrounding mountains, such as the Mountaingate Expansion, and responded with testimony at public hearings and letters to government officials.
- Proactively interfaced with builders, landowners and public officials in protecting neighbors' rights, community safety, and our natural surroundings, via code enforcement, septic siting, and technology review.
- Responded to property owners' requests for community information and assistance on numerous quality of life issues.
- Worked to keep our Canyon safe, clean and beautiful through clean ups, code enforcement, street repair and traffic control.
- Published the UMCA newsletter, the *Canyon Echoes*, featuring information and news of community concern.
- Provided Members with important e-mail alerts on matters of community interest.
- Issued annual Directory.
